Edith Craig (1869-1947) – illegitimate, lesbian, suffragette – was the most extraordinary contributor to British Theatre of her time. As an actor on stage and in silent movies, she was also a brilliant, costume designer, costume maker, stage producer, director and fencing expert. As she worked and toured throughout the UK and USA with her mother, the world famous actress Dame Ellen Terry and Sir Henry Irving, her memoirs throw light on that iconic theatrical partnership, illuminating in a most colourful way the magic that gripped audiences everywhere. Not only did she meet and work with other illustrious names of the day including Sarah Bernhardt, Lillie Langtry, George Bernard Shaw, Alfred Lord Tennyson, J.M. Barrie, Thomas Beecham, Richard D'Oyly Carte, Queen Alexandra, King George V, amongst others -but she also lived her personal life in a *ménage à trois!*

Edy began dictating her memoirs soon after Dame Ellen died in 1928 and revised them after the Second World War just before her own death in 1947. Now the memoirs are ready for all to read – complete with a lavish colourful collection of 64 rare photos and illustrations. **Ann Rachlin is launching the book at the British Film Institute on 4th November, an event that sold out in 2 days.**
